II.2.4) **Description of the procurement:**

Participation is open to all natural persons and firms (participating either individually or in a grouping - consortium - of tenderers) originating from all countries of the world.

A consortium may be a permanent, legally-established grouping or a grouping which has been constituted informally for a specific tender procedure. All partners of a consortium (i.e., the leader and all other partners) are jointly and severally liable to the contracting authority.

No more than one tender can be submitted by a natural or legal person whatever the form of participation (as an individual legal entity or as leader or partner of a consortium submitting a tender). In the event that a natural or legal person submits more than one tender, all tenders in which that person has participated will be excluded.

In case of lots, the candidates or tenderers may submit only one tender per lot. Contracts will be awarded lot by lot and each lot will form a separate contract.

Grounds for exclusion

At the latest during the evaluation procedure and before taking the award decision, the contracting authority ensures that there is no record of the successful tenderer, including consortium members, subcontractors or capacity providing entities, if any, in exclusion situations listed in Section 2.6.10.1. of the PRAG, December 2021, as well as in the Guide to Procurement for projects financed by the EIB, September 2018 (https://www.eib.org/attachments/strategies/guide_to_procurement_en.pdf), Section 1.4 (Ethical Conduct), Section 1.5 (Conflict of Interest), and Section 3.6 (Prohibited Conduct – Covenant of Integrity – template available in EIB Guide to Procurement, Annex 3), Anti-fraud policy of the EIB (<http://www.eib.org/infocentre/publications/all/anti-fraud-policy.htm>) and Section 3.8 Environmental and Social Covenant (E&S Covenant template is available in EIB Guide to Procurement, Annex 7).

During the evaluation procedure and before taking the award decision, the evaluation committee will request the original Declaration on honour on exclusion criteria and selection criteria and copies of documentary evidence for exclusion and selection criteria (also signed covenants) from the potential successful tenderer. If upon

verification, the evaluation committee considers the submitted evidence not admissible, it will request the same evidence from the second-best ranked tenderer.

It should be noted that, in the Covenant of Integrity, the tenderer is requested to self-declare all sanctions and/or exclusions (including any similar decisions having the effect of imposing conditions on the tenderer or its subsidiaries or to exclude the said tenderer or its subsidiaries, such as temporary suspension, conditional non-exclusion, etc.) imposed by the European institutions or any multilateral development banks (including the World Bank Group, the African Development Bank, the Asian Development Bank, European Bank for Reconstruction and Development, European Investment Bank or Inter-American Development Bank), regardless of the date of issue and the expiration or not of such decisions and of the current status of any sanction and/or exclusion. In this regard, any omission or misrepresentation, made knowingly or recklessly, may be considered as fraud under the EIB Anti-Fraud Policy. Therefore, the Client reserves the right to reject any offer presenting an inaccurate or incomplete Covenant of Integrity, and may cause the rejection of the offer for prohibited conduct. Covenant of Integrity and Environmental and Social Covenant are to be signed by Consortium and each Consortium member (including Consortium leader).

III.1.1) **Suitability to pursue the professional activity, including requirements relating to enrolment on professional or trade registers**

List and brief description of conditions:

The following selection criteria will be applied to candidates. In the case of a tender submitted by a consortium, these selection criteria will be applied to the consortium as a whole if not specified otherwise. The selection criteria will not be applied to natural persons and single-member companies when they are sub-contractors. No local preference provisions or local content provisions (such as national licenses, mandatory local sub-contracting, mandatory association with local companies, mandatory local workforce, etc.) are required in this Contract.

III.1.2) **Economic and financial standing**

List and brief description of selection criteria:

The reference period which will be taken into account will be the last three years for which accounts have been closed:

- the average annual turnover of the candidate over the last 3 years (2019, 2020 and 2021) must be at least 500 000 EUR;
- the average current ratio (current assets/current liabilities) over the last 3 years (2019, 2020 and 2021) must be greater than 1 (>1);

III.1.3) **Technical and professional ability**

List and brief description of selection criteria:

The reference period which will be taken into account will be the last five years preceding the submission deadline.

Professional capacity:

- The bidder must have at least eight (8) permanent staff. Permanent staff is staff whose employment is not based on fixed term contracts;

Technical capacity:

a) The candidate has delivered at least the same number of navigational buoys and at least the same number of inland/maritime navigational lanterns with remote monitoring capabilities in not more than two (2) contracts; Implemented at any moment during the reference period, meaning that the project(s) referred to could have been started/completed at any time during the indicated period but it does not have to be started and completed during that period, nor implemented during the entire period. Tenderers are allowed to refer either to projects completed within the reference period (although started earlier) or to projects not yet completed. Only the portion satisfactorily completed during the reference period (although started earlier) will be taken into consideration. This portion will have to be supported by documentary evidence (statement or certificate from the entity that awarded the contract or proof of final payment) also detailing its value.

If a project was implemented in a consortium, the percentage that the tenderer has completed must be stated in the evidence, together with a description of the services provided if the selection criteria relating to the pertinence of the experience have been used. Previous experience which caused breach of contract and termination by a CA shall not be used as reference.

Capacity-providing entities

An economic operator may rely on the capacities of other entities, regardless of the legal nature of the links which it has with them. In that case it must prove to the CA that it will have at its disposal the resources necessary for performance of the contract through a commitment by those entities placing those resources at its disposal. Such entities, must comply with the same rules of eligibility as the economic operator relying on them and with the selection criteria for which the economic operator relies on them. The data for this third entity for the relevant selection criterion should be included in a separate document. Evidence will also have to be provided when requested by the CA.

For the technical and professional criteria, an economic operator may only rely on the capacities of other entities where the latter will perform the tasks for which these capacities are required.

For the economic and financial criteria, the entities upon whose capacity the economic operator relies, become jointly and severally liable for the contract performance.
